#### **Format**

The BPL Cup brings the format of the highly successful Bowls Premier League directly to grassroots clubs in the form of a nationwide pathway competition. The competition progresses from Preliminary Rounds to Regional Finals and State/Territory Finals, and culminates with the National Final, this year to be staged during the Bowls Premier League at Club Pine Rivers from 10 – 14 November 2024. In 2023, there were 954 registered teams (some 3,100 players) who competed across the nation over122 preliminary rounds between February and August.

Matches will again be played in a two bowl triples format. Matches consist of two sets of five ends with a one end tie-breaker if required. There is also be one optional trial end per match.

To ensure quick play, there are no jack rolls, instead jacks are to be placed by the team that controls the mat. Ideally, there will be two jacks for each rink (one jack left at each end).

The BPL Cup is an open gender competition, therefore teams can consist of all genders. All players within a team must be from the same club which is affiliated to your State and/or

Territory Association (i.e. the club which players are a paid member and play their club championships with.

All host venues will be sent the Conditions of Play document upon registering to run an event and they can also be accessed through the Bowls Australia website <a href="https://example.com/here/">here</a>.

#### **Dates**

- Preliminary Rounds from 10 February through to Sunday 11 August 2024.
- > Regional Finals (venues TBC) are to be played by Sunday 15 September 2024.
- > State/Territory Finals (venues TBC) will be played by Sunday 29 September 2024.
- ➤ National Final (Club Pine Rivers) will be played from Sunday 10 14 November 2024

#### Venues

Venues for Regional and State/Territory Finals venues are to be determined by the BPL Cup Committee, in consultation with the Club Support Managers, from the list of venues that have expressed interest.

### **National Final**

Winning teams from State/Territory BPL Cup Finals will be flown and accommodated in Brisbane to play at Club Pine Rivers in parallel with BPL20 – played from Sunday 10 -14 November 2024 for the BPL Cup National Final.

This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for many bowlers, with the final match at the National Finals showcasing all the elements of a BPL match including the use of the electronic scoreboard, ground announcer, and use of the TV show-rink inside the grandstands.

States and Territories will be allocated the following number of National Finalists' spots.

For 2024, allocations are as follows:

Information relating to the National Finals will be sent directly to the successful teams.

## Uniform

Competing clubs teams are required to wear their regular club uniforms in all BPL Cup matches (all players matching).

These uniforms and their included sponsor brand marks must be in line with the Bowls Australia's Logo Policy.

### **Umpires**

Each match of the BPL Cup will have at least one appointed umpire.

The respective host venues will be required to allocate an umpire for each round of the BPL Cup. If a host venue is unable to provide an umpire, the host club must approach another

Club/Association within the region to try and appoint an umpire. If the region is unable to provide an umpire, the club must contact their Club Support Manager's for assistance.

## **Venue Results**

Host venues are required to submit results to Bowls Australia within two hours of the completion of events. The results must be uploaded via the BPL Cup competition management portal in BowlsLink. Instructions for entering results will be emailed to host clubs in the lead up to your event.

Results (and draws) will be made available via the BowlsLink Results portal here.

#### Awards

Winners of each State/Territory BPL Cup final will be provided with airfares and accommodation for up to 3 players (where appropriate) to attend the National BPL Cup Finals (4<sup>th</sup> players included at own cost) from Sunday through to Thursday.

The following awards will be presented at the conclusion of the National BPL Cup Finals.

- ➤ Winner's medallions
- > Finalists' medallions
- Player of the National Final medallion
- Perpetual BPL Cup Trophy

The total value of awards, airfares and accommodation exceeds \$60,000.
